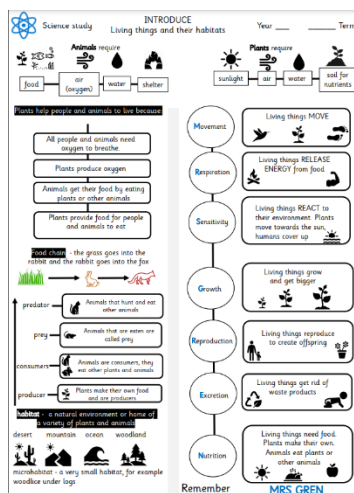
Christian Distinctiveness
