Our Shrove Tuesday celebrations/preparations were a great success. A huge thank you the parent volunteers and the school




### **Spring Blooms**


Lots of our bulbs are starting to bloom across the school grounds please can we ask that the children don't pick these so that they are around for everyone to enjoy for as long as possible!
