



What genres do you love? What authors are your favourite? What makes a book amazing? We are going to share our favourite books to help you decide what you like!






# We promise to talk it up, take turns and tune in.

When we take part in whole class daily reading it is a safe space where we can explore books, share our ideas in a safe and respectful environment and learn the skills for life long reading.






# We promise to work with parents so that reading doesn't only happen at school.
